**CONSTRUCTION START NOTICE**  
**LEEVILLE PIKE AND CROWELL LANE INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS**

*September 17, 2019*

Please be advised of the pending road improvements at the intersection of Leeville Pike and Crowell Lane. The improvements include road widening on Leeville Pike to add left turn lanes in each direction and a traffic signal at the intersection. This project, once complete, will improve the overall function of this intersection.

Over the course of this year, there has been a great deal of coordination with the various utility providers in the area to ensure the road construction project goes as smoothly as possible. The construction work currently in progress involves the relocation of the existing water main and the movement of overhead wires. The gas main will also be relocated soon. To expedite the process of the water and gas main relocations, the City added these to existing projects.

Our contractor for the road construction portion of the construction work is Rawso Construction. They recently completed a new road project for the City near the airport (Aviation Way). They did a great job on that road and we are confident they will here as well. Their Notice to Proceed with construction will be issued on September 18, 2019, with a project completion date of June 15, 2020.

The majority of this project is being completed within the existing City-owned right-of-way and easements. The few easements that we needed to obtain are in place, thanks to the cooperation of property owners in the area.

During the construction process, there will be noise, lane closures, road closures (limited), uneven pavement, etc. This is all part of the process and is unavoidable during construction. The City will make every effort to notify the community in advance of any road closures by posting to our website ([lebanontn.org](http://lebanontn.org)) and our Public Services Facebook page (City of Lebanon, TN – Public Services). Our Facebook page is a great source of information for this project as well as other Public Services functions.

You will notice construction signage soon along with a reduced speed limit. Please proceed with caution through this intersection as the safety of residents traveling on the roadways and that of the construction crews and inspection staff are of the utmost importance. If at all possible, it is advisable to take alternate routes to avoid this area as much as possible during construction. If not, please allow additional time to travel through this intersection for the next few months.
